





Mr. Mintah Adu-Parkoh was born to the Late Nana Kofi Ahenkora II, former chief of OfoaseAsante Akyim and Obaapanyin Abena Afriyie on November 11, 1963, in Ofoase, Asante Akyem.

He spent his early years in Ofoase, being baptized into the Presbyterian church at Ofoase, where he remained a distant member till his passing.

His educational journey began at Ofoase Presby Primary School, completing his basic education at Ofoase L. A. Middle School. He continued to Konongo Odumase Secondary School as a science student where he obtained his "O" and "A" level certificates.

He furthered at University of Cape Coast, graduating with honours in Chemistry.







His working career started out as a chemistry teacher at Techiman Secondary School, taking up positions such as housemaster, entertainment master, quiz master (which earned him the nickname "Sorry", as he had a habit of asking students to repeat answers), and eventually as head of science department.

His dedication and immense contribution to the field of education was rewarded in the year 2000 when he was crowned as overall best science teacher in Brong Ahafo region.






COCOBOD YEARS

Mr. Adu-Parkoh Mintah was employed into the service of COCOBOD through Quality Control Company Limited on 15th February, 2001 as a Quality Control Officer.

He made an impact on every project not only on the outcomes but also on the hearts of people he came into contact with. This made him rise through the ranks of the Company until he retired as a Deputy Quality Control Manager.

He was affectionately called "Onaapo" by colleagues at Kaase Inland port because of his love for a popular political song.


His wonderful work ethic earned him various accolades including a citation presented by the company.



Baptised into the Presbyterian Church at an early age, he remained an active member occupying positions such as senior presbytership and choir patronship at various districts. He was instrumental in establishing a local Presbyterian Church at Abesim-Dominase, Sunyani. His love for mankind was only superseded by that for God. The Holy Bible and Presbyterian Hymn Book were his favorite books.

In 2001, he joined QCCL - COCOBOD resulting in us moving to Sunyani, now with four children (Ellens, Afriyie and Louis).

You are irreplaceable, but God knows best.




